

According to Article 13(1) and (2) of the Regulation of the European Parliament and Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation; hereinafter referred to as "GDPR"), we would like to inform you that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is the Academic Computing Centre Cyfronet AGH with a registered office at Nawojki 11, 30-950, Kraków, Poland; National Business Registry Number (REGON): 00000157700022; e-mail address: [cyfronet@cyfronet.pl](mailto:cyfronet@cyfronet.pl), phone: +48 12 632 33 55 (hereinafter referred to as "the Administrator" and "ACC Cyfronet AGH").
2. In matters related to processing of personal data, you can contact the Administrator at [daneosobowe@cyfronet.pl](mailto:daneosobowe@cyfronet.pl).
3. The legal basis for the processing of personal data by ACC Cyfronet AGH is provided by Art. 6(1)(b) or (f) GDPR.
4. Your personal data will be processed:
  - a. To ensure the performance of a contract to which the data subject is party (Article 6(1)(b) GDPR),
  - b. For the purposes of legitimate interests pursued by the Administrator, including in particular determination of factual circumstances, investigation and defense against putative claims against the Administrator (Article 6(1)(f) GDPR).
5. Your personal data will be processed only insofar as is necessary to meet the goals listed in point 4, and after this time for the period and to the extent required by the generally applicable law and for the storage period in accordance with the internal regulations of ACC Cyfronet AGH.
6. You are entitled to demand access to your personal data, rectify incorrect personal data, erasure personal data, transfer personal data and restrict the processing of personal data by the Administrator - in circumstances and in under the terms identified in GDPR.
7. You are entitled to object to the processing of your personal data in circumstances identified in Article 21(1)and (2) GDPR.
8. You are entitled to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (Stawki 2, 00-193 Warsaw) if you believe that the processing of your personal data by the Administrator constitutes a violation of GDPR.
9. The processing of personal data does not include automated decision-making (without human involvement) or profiling.
10. Your personal data may be exposed to third parties, when such an obligation results from legal provisions or on the basis of contracts concluded by the Administrator. In particular, access to your personal data may be provided to entities from which the Administrator procures services (including legal, advisory and control services).

11. Your personal data will not be transferred to countries which are not member states of the European Economic Area or to international organizations, except where the Administrator faces a legal obligation to do so.
12. Your personal data is provided to the Administrator on a voluntary basis; however, failing to provide such data will render the Administrator unable to provide services to the user.
